



A Guide to Some Environmental Weeds of the Bendigo Region

This list of environmental weeds is intended as a general guide only. Some plants listed are Declared Noxious Weeds proclaimed under the *Catchment and Land Protection Act 1994*, but many are not. Environmental Weeds are plants which invade natural areas such as bushland. They compete with native vegetation, significantly altering the environmental values of an area. These infestations not only affect native plant populations but also have a severe impact on our native animals by altering their natural habitat.
